PAROLE SIMULATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

On May 18th, we partnered with UI Center for Human Rights, UI LABB, UI Chief Diversity Office, and IowaWorks for the BUILD: Re-Entry and Parole Simulation.

The event allowed participants to experience first-hand the challenges and struggles that citizens returning

from incarceration face when re-entering life on the outside. There was an excellent turnout, and participants left with an increased awareness of the barriers facing our community members. Stay tuned, as we are currently developing the ability to deliver the parole simulations on our own.
