THE PAGE STREET REENTRY HOUSE IS NOW OPEN!

We have officially launched our 6-bedroom Reentry House for men leaving incarceration. After an incredible effort by staff and volunteers to prepare the house to welcome our new residents, we have opened our doors. Thanks to donations of furniture and home goods, every room has been thoughtfully designed to make residents feel comfortable and at home. Each single-unit bedroom is fully furnished and move-in ready. Several common spaces will allow for socializing, group activities, and supportive programming focused on the issues important to those returning to the community.



Each resident will be greeted with a Welcome Kit full of essentials. Inside Out Staff will assist residents with getting IDs, social security cards and other immediate needs to make their arrival easier, and supportive services will continue for the duration of their stay. We are excited to welcome new residents to the Page Street Reentry House and to the Inside Out Reentry Community!

QUARTERLY BACKPACK DRIVE

An overlooked key need to successful reentry is access to personal care items. Inside Out provides backpacks filled with items to members upon release from incarceration. In 2022, IO provided 77 backpacks to members in need - more than double the number of backpacks provided in 2021 - and we are on pace for distributing even more backpacks in 2023! We couldn't have met that need without donations from individuals and community groups!
