PROVIDING SUPPORT AND FRIENDSHIP THROUGH OUR MENTOR PROGRAM

Inside Out has a huge need right now for mentors! We acknowledge that reentry is not an easy process and our mentoring program aims to provide returning citizens with social, emotional and practical support through meaningful companionship. Our Inside Out volunteer mentors provide non-judgemental support for mentees as they navigate their reentry process and achieve their goals. Correspondence, which frequently begins during incarceration, can transition into activities like meeting for coffee or resource connection following release. Friendships take time to build; the mentoring relationship provides opportunity for a mutually beneficial relationship and genuine connection to blossom.
